



## COVID-19 CATCH UP PREMIUM PLAN 20/21

At Kelvin Grove Primary School, we take a holistic approach to our children's needs. We offer our children an excellent education experience which is enjoyable and stimulating, enabling them to achieve their full potential.

The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds. Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months, in line with the curriculum expectations for the next academic year in [actions for schools during the coronavirus outbreak](#).

While schools can use their funding in a way that suits their cohort and circumstances, they are expected to use this funding for specific activities which will help pupils catch up on missed education. Schools do not need to spend the funds in the financial year beginning 1 April 2020 and may carry some or all catch-up premium funds forward to future financial years if they wish.

- Purchase of reading programmes/resources.
- Purchase of Maths programmes/resources.
- Purchase of technology to support pupils to access additional learning.

### How the impact of the fund on educational attainment

- Pupils have been assessed and identified as needing to catch up lost ground when compared to the rest of their year group in key subject areas.
- Pupils will be assessed periodically to check that they are making up lost ground.
- Assessment will be mainly by teacher judgement.
